

# CENTER PARTICIPATES IN BRUSOV UNIVERSITY "JOB FAIR"



ACNIS staff Marina Abrahamian, Ashkhen Musheghian and Richard Giragosian represented the Center at a "job fair" organized on May 15 by Brusov University. Center staff manned a display table and distributed samples of some of the Center's most prominent reports and publications. Stemming from a broader commitment to strengthening education in Armenia, the Center works closely with the faculty and administration of both the Yerevan State and Brusov Universities and regularly provides lectures, workshops and trainings for university students.

## ACNIS PROVIDES BRIEFING TO VISITING OXFAM OFFICIALS



On May 19, the Center hosted a group of visiting senior officials

from the London headquarters of the non-governmental organization OXFAM International. ACNIS Director Richard Giragosian provided a briefing on the latest economic and political developments in Armenia and the broader region. Since 2009, the Center has provided assistance to OXFAM in its strategic planning and programs in Armenia.

#### CENTER DIRECTOR ADDRESSES REGIONAL CONFERENCE



On May 21-22, ACNIS Director Richard Giragosian participated in a two-day conference in Yerevan sponsored

by the Caucasus Institute. The conference, entitled "Main Trends in the Caucasus: 2009," was attended by leading experts from Georgia, Russia, and Turkey. Giragosian presented a report on political and economic developments in Armenia in 2009.

#### ACNIS HOLDS SPECIAL WORKSHOP FOR STUDENTS AND YOUTH ACTIVISTS




On May 24, the Center held a two-part special workshop for students and youth activists. The first part focused on the use of "political technology" in Armenian political campaigns, including the crafting of political messages, slogans and imagery.

The second part of the special workshop consisted of a presentation on leveraging social →

← networking technology for civic and political activism. Several dozen students and youth activists participated in the event, which was the latest in a series of special ACNIS workshops providing training in a wide range of areas, including research, analysis and writing, as well as oral presentation and debating skills.



### CENTER STAFF PARTICIPATE IN RUSSIAN SEMINAR



ACNIS Administrative Director Karapet Kalenchian and Senior Analyst Manvel Sargsian represented the Center at a seminar in Yerevan on May 25 entitled "The Situation in the Caucasus and Perspective of Regional Security." Sargsian presented a formal report on Nagorno Karabagh at the event, which was organized by the Moscow-based "Institute of CIS Countries."



### ACNIS PRESENTS SPECIAL ANALYSIS OF RECENT DEVELOPMENTS IN SEVERAL KEY COUNTRIES



The Center organized a special presentation on May 26 assessing recent developments in several key countries, with a focus on the implications for Armenia. ACNIS Director Richard Giragosian presented an analysis addressing the recent political unrest in Thailand, the economic crisis in Greece, lingering instability in Kyrgyzstan, and the continuing political crisis in Iran.



The presentation was attended by over twenty guests, including Ambassador Sergey Kapinos, the head of the OSCE Office in Yerevan, and other representatives from the diplomatic community, international organizations and a number of students, analysts and journalists.



#### CENTER PROVIDES CLOSED BRIEFING ON REGIONAL DEVELOPMENTS



In the fourth in a regular series of monthly briefings, **ACNIS** Director Richard Giragosian provided a closed briefing on May 27 focusing on current developments in Armenia and the

region. The Center's monthly briefings provide international organizations and the diplomatic community in Armenia with an independent source of analysis and information on political, economic and security-related issues, with an added analysis of regional issues and trends.

Participants included Lithuanian Ambassador Giedrius Apuokas, Ambassador Sergey Kapinos, the Head of the OSCE Office in Yerevan, Sylvia Zehe, the Special Representative of the Secretary General of the Council of Europe, and representatives from the Italian, Polish, Romanian and U.S. embassies, as well as from the United Nations, the EU Advisory Group to Armenia, the Armenian Assembly of America and the Armenian Ministry of Justice.

### ACNIS HOLDS SPECIAL PREPARATORY **BRIEFING FOR YOUTH ACTIVISTS**



In preparation for a meeting between youth activists from Armenia, Azerbaijan and Karabagh organized by the Council of Europe, the Center held a special preparatory briefing for the participants from Armenia and Karabagh on May 28. ACNIS Director Richard Giragosian briefed the participants on key issues related to the Karabagh conflict and provided practical training on debating and oral presentation skills.


